CHARACTER EDUCATION

- 1. The Charlottesville City Schools shall establish a character education program in its schools that matches the purposes outlined in Policy IGAI. This program may be a part of an existing program or a separate program offered during the school year or during the summer.
- 2. The program shall be cooperatively developed with students, parents, and the community and periodically reviewed by a committee.
- 3. Character education shall be interwoven into the school procedures and environment so as to instruct primarily by example, illustration, and participation, in such a way as to complement the Standards of Learning.
- 4. The program shall also address the unacceptable nature of bullying, as defined in the Student Conduct Policy Guidelines adopted by the Board of Education pursuant to § 22.1-279.6.
- 5. Each school character education program shall:
 - specify those character traits to be taught, selecting from those which are common to diverse social, cultural, and religious groups.
 - be implemented at the elementary and secondary levels.
 - provide for relevant professional development and adequate resources.
 - include a method for program evaluation.
- 6. The character education program for each school shall be designed by a team to include the principal or designee, school counselor, teachers and parents.
- 7. A schedule of events to emphasize character education should be available for review by parents.
